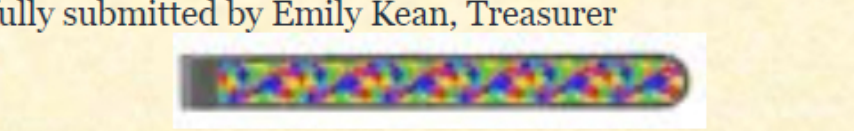

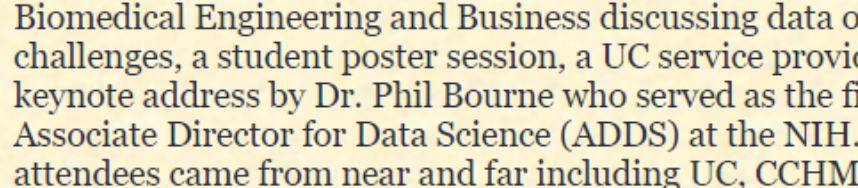
Technology Committee Updates

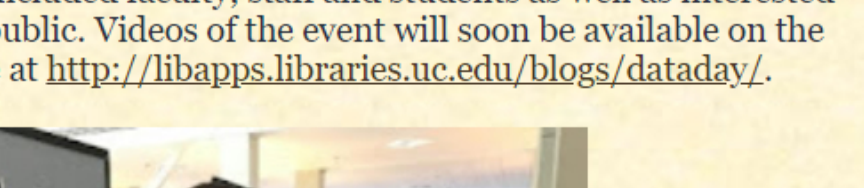
Data Day 2017

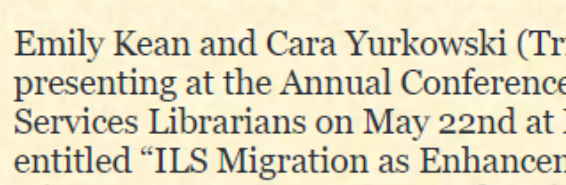
Gates Foundation Weighs in on "Open Access"
 According to a recent article in *The Economist* (March 25, 2017), The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation has selected the open-access repository maintained by the United Kingdom's Wellcome Trust to be the freely available source of all reports of research it supports. The article discusses at length the way that scientific publication is changing from the traditional subscription-based journals to open archives such as arXiv for physicists. However, there is only a slight mention of the NIH and nothing about PubMed Central which has been the repository for NIH-sponsored research since it instituted an open-access policy in 2008.

OHSLA Spring Meeting

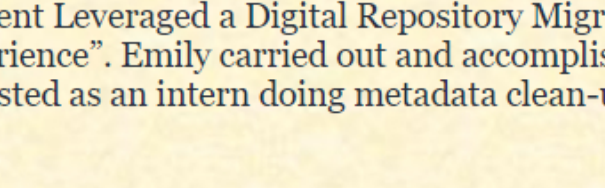
